## HOW DO CONTACT LENSES WORK?

Each contact lens is made according to a prescription to focus light on the retina of your eye, similar to what the lenses in eyeglasses do. However, contact lenses correct your entire field of vision because all images reaching the eyes pass through the lenses.



## THE MANY TYPES OF CONTACT LENSES.

Drs. Kline and Boyd will prescribe the most appropriate contact lenses based on your prescription and individual needs. They offer the full spectrum of contact lenses, including:

*Daily-wear lenses* — Designed to be put in when you wake up and taken out before you go to sleep.

*Extended-wear lenses* — These soft lenses can be worn longer than 24 hours, even while sleeping and, in some cases, up to 30 days.

*Bifocal lenses* — To correct both nearsightedness and farsightedness.

*Toric lenses* — To correct astigmatism.

*Soft lenses* — Made from extremely soft plastic, these lenses offer the ultimate in comfort because they cause less friction on the eyelid.

*Rigid gas-permeable lenses* — These lenses float in the tear fluid, allowing more oxygen to reach the cornea when you blink.

*Colored lenses* — A popular choice among fashion-conscious people.

*Daily disposable lenses* — A great choice if you have sensitivities to contact lens solutions or are prone to allergic reactions to contact lenses.

*Aphakic lenses* — For children who have had congenital cataracts removed.
